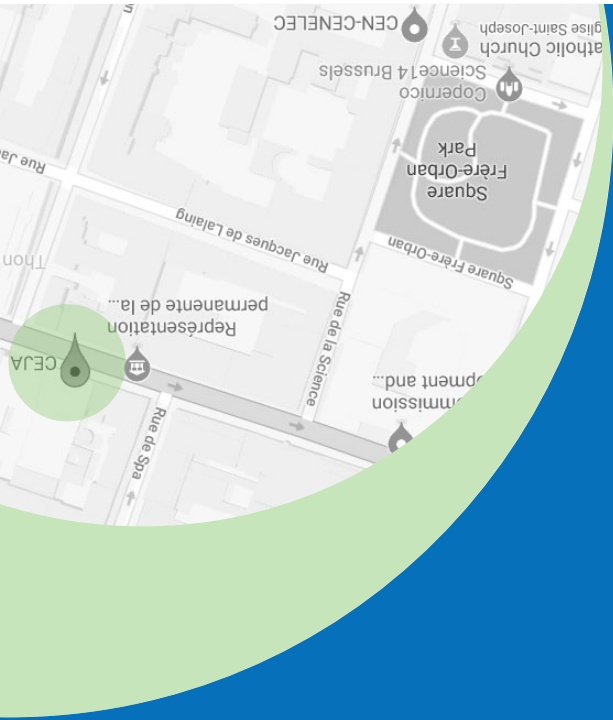

What we do

What is the European Council of Young Farmers (CEJA)

CEJA is a non-profit international organisation. It is the umbrella body for the young farmers' organisations of Europe.

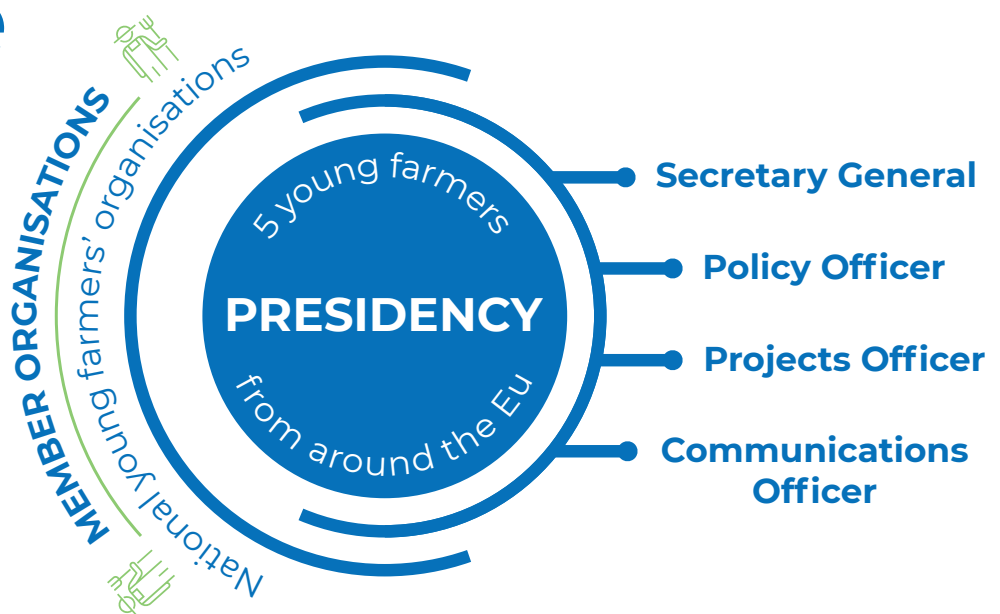
It is officially recognised as representing the interests of part of the agricultural sector and contributes to the development of policies and debates.

Since when?

CEJA was founded in Rome in **1958** when young farmers' organisations from the six initial Member States of the European Coal and Steel Community (ECSC) set up a "Comité d'Entente".

It represents around
2 million young farmers
from **22 countries**
and **31 national member organisations**.

Structure



How we work

CEJA is run according to democratic principles and is governed by its General Assembly.

It is led by its Presidency which meets on a regular basis and whose members are elected every two years by the General Assembly.

CEJA delegates meet regularly during working groups where they establish CEJA's positions on various issues.

The CEJA Secretariat is based in Brussels and takes care of the day to day management of the organisation.
